## La Manga Golf - North Course



**La Manga Golf North Course** is quite a bit shorter than the South Course with narrower fairways and very large greens. The course winds its way between large palm trees, large lakes and deep gullies making it a fantastic test of golf for all handicaps, but the biggest challenge of all is the undulating greens which are a great test of putting.

**La Manga Club** is without doubt the name that everyone in golf recognizes when you talk about golf in Murcia, Spain. It's choice of three superb, 18 hole championship courses, each with its own unique golfing challenge makes this a must for every golfer visiting the area.

La Manga Club has been host over the years to the **Spanish Open** for both men and women, **Junior Championships** and **PGA Championships**. It is a place where the rich and famous have come together to holiday and play golf.

## La Manga Golf - South Course



**La Manga Golf South Course** was originally designed by Robert Putman in 1971 and subsequently remodelled by Arnold Palmer in 1992, it was completely refurbished in 2004. The course runs through the centre of the valley where the wide fairways are lined with palm trees and water hazards come into play on 15 out of the 18 holes.

The two par 3's on the front nine measure over 200 metres each and some of the long par 4's will require long irons into the green avoiding the lakes and bunkers.

The back nine is a little shorter but brings in a few dog-leg holes and the shots into the greens on 11 and 12 both cross water demanding accurate club selection.

The par 5, 18th, with the water on both sides of the fairway and a ravine just short of a well-protected green will demand concentration right to the end.

### **La Manga Golf - West Course**



**La Manga Golf West Course** is quite different to the other two courses. It offers outstanding views and follows the natural contours of the undulating land.

The pine trees, storm gullies and tight fairways on the front nine require more accuracy than length, whilst the back nine creeps up the hills and down the valleys and is much more open.

The par 3's will have you going through the bag wondering just what club is required to hit, they are all fantastic golf holes, accuracy and course management as opposed to length is the order of the day here.
